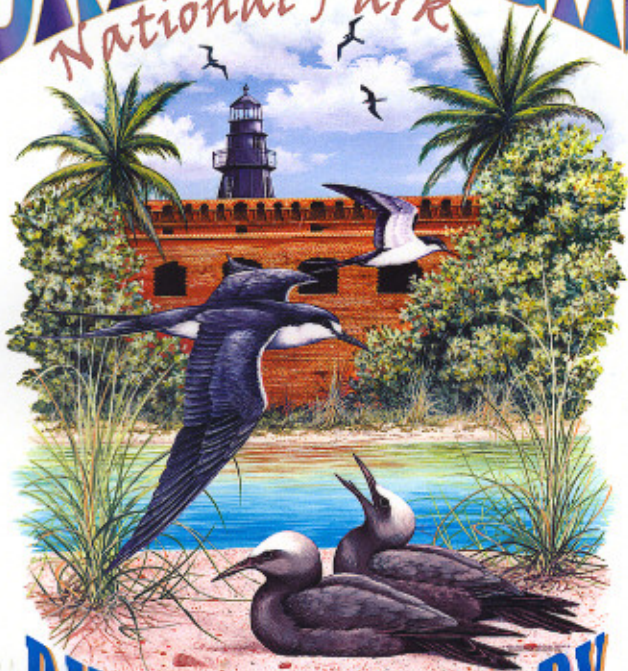


Dry Tortugas National Park is located almost 70 miles west of Key West, Florida. Its 115 square nautical miles (64,657 acres) encompass a striking combination of historic resources and a pristine subtropical marine environment. The park originally was established as Fort Jefferson National Monument in 1935. Congress designated the area as a national park in 1992 to protect the coral reefs, fisheries, nesting birds, sea turtles and other wildlife. Dry Tortugas National Park offers every visitor an opportunity to understand and appreciate a rare combination of natural, historic, marine, and scenic resources.
